Cari F. Silverman is dedicated to clients who have suffered catastrophic injuries or have lost loved ones due to negligence.

Silverman, 28, focuses on personal injury, nursing home and medical malpractice matters at Levin & Perconti.

Silverman, a graduate of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign College of Law, secured a \$6 million settlement for the family of a deceased 58-year-old woman who suffered a fatal brain injury due to medical negligence.

In a case against a Chicago hospital, Silverman secured a \$3.5 million settlement for a family who lost their newborn as result of oxygen deprivation and multiple other injuries. In another case, Silverman secured a \$4.75 million settlement for the family of a man who died after physicians delayed reading a MRA.

Silverman has a number of high dollar awards for nursing home neglect victims as well, and in the last year obtained a \$1.4 million settlement and two \$750,000 settlements in nursing home pressure sore cases.

William J. Rogers, of Swanson, Martin & Bell, LLP, represented a hospital in a case with Silverman as opposing counsel. He was impressed with her lawyering skills, and said she conducted herself as a seasoned professional wise beyond her years, especially in depositions.
