This announcement comes as community activists and SEIU workers plan to rally Thursday morning at the facility to raise awareness surrounding a supply shortage.

“We understand the union’s concerns,” said Levin. “Our firm has represented hundreds of victims of nursing home abuse and neglect. The root of this epidemic lies in the fact that many nursing home owners put profits before the safety and wellbeing of the people they serve.”

“Owners often operate nursing homes at minimal staffing levels with limited supplies to save money,” said Levin. “This puts a strain on the employees charged with caring for residents, and makes it impossible for them to deliver appropriate care to residents. We support the workers in their call for an end to the supply shortage at the Center Home for Hispanic Elderly, and other nursing homes throughout Illinois.”
